EGR Fish for All: A Catch, Watch, Learn and Release Program

n August of 2006 the East Grand Rapids Library had its grand reopening after being expanded and renovated. The library grew in size from approximately 11,000 square feet to 28,000 square feet! This was a wonderful realization of years of L fundraising and planning by the Friends of the Library and our whole community.

donations from individuals, groups and corporations began in the spring of 2005.

The major faction of the fundraising was a "Kids' \$1 Campaign," held in conjunction with local EGR elementary schools. We involved the children of the community in this venture. All who donated during this campaign were acknowledged in Friends of the Library literature and on the special plaque on the aquariums. etting creative during Covid has been a fun challenge, and librarians have been **T** constantly working on ways to provide patrons with safe activities to enjoy in-branch. Luckily, our Lab space (whose creation was sponsored by the Friends) has wraparound glass walls. This makes it easy for patrons to peer inside and watch things happen. We've already featured a seek-and-find Mouse House and a Keva Planks diorama - now, to keep the STEAM ball rolling, EGR librarians have created an indoor "Growing Garden."

With seeds from the KDL Seed Library, a new grow light, and diligent watering, little sprouts have started to emerge! Basil, Swiss chard, green beans and thyme are just a few of the vegetables and herbs currently growing in our windowsill pots. Growing vegetables indoors is tricky, and our results may not be one hundred percent successful. However, we know patrons will enjoy watching the process... and maybe even will learn from our "scientific" mistakes. Stop by the KDL Lab downstairs next time you visit the library. During the fifteen months it took to redo the library, there was a fundraising campaign project, separate from the voter approved library expansion vote. This "EGR Fish for All" campaign consisted of private donations aimed directly at bringing a 240-gallon freshwater aquarium and a 150-gallon turtle tank into the children's area of the new library. The cost of the project also included cabinetry to hold the

tanks and plumbing. Final cost for the project was \$18,000. Collection of
